> -Van Gorder lived in a secluded part of the country, in a large frame house. He was last seen at dusk last night, when he and his sister were in the barnyard. At 6:30 o'clock this morning, Herbert Actual Resources Rice, a neighbor, visited the house and he was herrified to find the dead bodies of the two in the kitchen and the house in great disorder. A glycerine explosion occurred Everywhere evidences of the crime were visible.

There must have been a struggle, as the walls were spattered with seriously injuring Homer Hill and blood and the furniture was wrecked. The clothing of the victims was Motto, Fideli Certa Marces (the Chester Fortner, who were pulling disheveled and their heads were battered to a pulp. Both were lying in the kitchen within a few feet of each other. A bloody monkey wrench and a large file, matted with hair, were

found beside the bodies. The wrench had been used on the man and the woman was killed with the file. Stab wounds were on the body, evidently made with the file. The safe which Van Gorder kept in his house was broken and


