

SCAR S. STRAUS, candidate for governor of New York, has been honored by four presidents, one of them a Democrat, being appointed minister to Turkey by two, cabinet member by a third Harrington has been unable to and ambassador to Turkey by the fourth.

President Grover Cleveland appointed him minister to Turkey in 1887. He served till 1889. President William McKinley again appointed Mr. Straus minister to Turkey in 1898. This time he served till 1901.

Precident Theodore Roosevelt in 1902 named him a member of the permanent court of arbitration at The Hague and in 1906 made him secretary of commerce and labor, in which position he served till

President William Howard Taft in May, 1909, chose Mr. Straus ambassador to Turkey, in which capacity he served till December, 1910, covering the memorable days of the Turkish revolution.
