### GIVE BETTER SERVICE

Erie Will Stop Train No. 5 at Canaseraga and Portage

Albany, Oct. 5.—After negotiations between the Erie Railroad, the public-service commission and the complainants in the village of Canaseraga an arrangement has been made whereby train service will be provided which will enable residents to go to Buffalo or Rochester in the morning, transact their business in those places and return the same day.

The Erie is now ordered in response to its offer to stop its fast through train No. 5, at Canaseraga and Portage in addition to its present stops at Silver Springs, Warsaw and Attica. The train will stop at Canaseraga about 5:30 a. m., making connections at Silver Springs, which will permit passengers to reach Rochester at 8:15 a. m. and Buffalo at 7:05 a. m.

The commission has vacated its previous order which compelled the railroad to restore to regular schedule between Hornell and Castile its local trains known as Nos. 478 and 475. The railroad objected to this order as an undue hardship.

The approval of the public-service commission has been given the Warsaw Gas & Electric company for the exercise of a franchise for the distribution of electricity in the village of Gamesville and the towns of Gamesville and Warsaw.

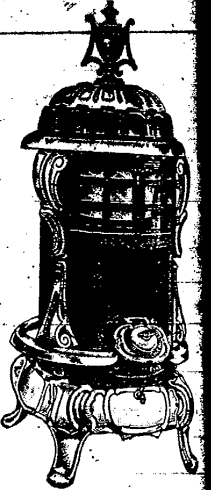
