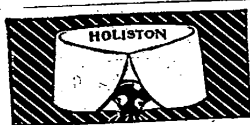

### VILLAGE ORDINANCE

It is Hereby Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Andover, N. Y., in regular session assembled on this 1st day of December 1915, as follows:

That section 1, of Article VII, of Village Ordinance be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1. No person shall ring bells, blow horns or cry goods, wares or other commodities or hawk or peddle the same in any of the streets of this village; or auctioneering, or selling goods, wares or merchandise of any kind or description within the limits of this Corporation, without first having obtained a license therefor from the President of the Village, which license fee is hereby fixed at:

For hawking or peddling; for each peddler using a hand cart, basket or other receptacle TWO DOLLARS per day except for wearing apparel and materials for same the license shall be FIVE DOLLARS per day; and for each peddler using one-horse, two-horse or motor vehicle FIVE DOLLARS per day except for wearing apparel and materials for same the license shall be TEN DOLLARS per day.

For each Auctioneer the license shall be FIFTEEN DOLLARS per day.

This section, however, shall not be construed to prohibit the sale of meats, provisions, fruit and farm produce or the sale by auction of second-hand household goods and wares; live stock and farm implements held by residents of this village on their own premises without a license.

And that section 3 of Article VII, be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 3. Whoever shall violate any provisions of these ordinances under this Article shall be subject to a penalty of not less than TEN DOLLARS nor more than TWENTY DOLLARS for each and every violation to the use of said village; and also a violation thereof shall constitute disorderly conduct, and the person so violating the same shall be and hereby declared to be a disorderly person.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately from and after its posting and publication or personal service according to law.
