NOTICE OF SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

Notice is hereby given, that pursuant to an application made therefor as provided by the statute in such case made and provided, which application was duly filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Angelica, Allegany County, N. Y., on the 31st day of December 1921, the following proposition will be submitted, to be voted upon by ballot, at a Special Town Meeting duly called therefor, to be held in said Town of Angelica, on the 28th day of January 1922, to wit:—

Shall the Town of Angelica, erect and construct a steel bridge 200 feet in length upon steel tube abutments filled with piles and concrete, with a roadway 14 feet in width, at what is known as the former site of "The Church Bridge" across the Genesee River in said town, at an expense not to exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars; which proposed bridge shall take the place of the so called "Church Bridge" recently destroyed; and to issue the bonds of the said town to the amount of ten thousand dollars, for such purpose and the payment thereof, said bonds to be issued and disposed of in accordance with the provisions of law in such case made and provided, and to bear date as of April 1st, 1922, to mature in annual installments of \$2,000.00 each, from and inclusive of the 1st day of April 1925 to and inclusive of the 1st day of April 1932; and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed five per cent per annum, and payable semi-annually on the 1st days of October and April in each year from the date thereof, and that there shall be annually levied in and by the Town of Angelica, a tax sufficient to pay the interest of said bonds and the principal thereof, as the same shall become due.

And for the transaction of such other business as may lawfully come before such meeting.
