Of Interest to Farmers

WORMS IN SWINE CAUSE MANY ILLS

Fully 50 Per Cent. of Pig Ailments are Attributed to This Reason—Some Preventatives

With fully half of the ailments to which pigs are heir attributed to worms, all who raise even one or two porkers will be interested in the preventive measures suggested by the animal husbandry workers at the State College of Agriculture.

According to the college workers, nearly all hogs have worms, especially during the early period of their lives. They usually become infested during the suckling and weaning period, and the ravages generally decrease as the hogs become older.

Sanitary premises, a liberal use of common disinfectants, and keeping the hogs in a thrifty condition are said to be among the very best preventives. It is also suggested that the following mineral mixture be kept before the hogs at all times: 30 pounds charcoal, 10 pounds ground limestone, 10 pounds salt, 1 pound sulfur and 1 pound copper sulfate.

ABOUT HUBAM CLOVER

No particular superiority of Hubam sweet clover over the common white biennial variety has yet been established, according to the State College of Agriculture at Ithaca. It should be considered a variety that may supplement the biennial, and not one to replace it. The seed is still very high in price. One is not justified in seeding a large area, the college declares. If grown at all, it should be in a very restricted area, for trial.

GRAIN A better feeling existed in the trade throughout the week and prices advanced, Chicago May wheat up 8 closing at \$1.35, Chicago May corn up 3c at 59c.

Wheat: World wheat situation higher foreign markets, decrease in visible supply, and improved milling demand. Carlot receipts at Chicago during week ending Feb. 10: 204 wheat, 3,644 corn; 644 oats, as compared with 100 wheat, 1,766 corn 339 oats same period last year.

Closing prices in Chicago cash market No. 2, red winter wheat \$1.34; No. 2, hard winter wheat \$1.28; No. 2, mixed corn 54c; No. 2, yellow corn 54c; No. 3, white oats 37c.

Average farm prices: No. 2, mixed-corn in Central Iowa about 41c; No. 1, dark Northern wheat in Central North Dakota \$1.27 1/2; No. 2, hard winter wheat in Central Kansas \$1.12.

For the week: Minneapolis May wheat up 6c at \$1.36 1/2; Kansas City May wheat up 6 1/2c at \$1.22; Winnipeg May wheat up 8 1/2c at \$1.27 1/2.

Hay Timothy market fairly steady at unchanged prices. Alfalfa firm at Kansas City and Chicago. Prairie duck-Low grades very slow sale.

Same accumulation of poor hay at Cincinnati. Quoted Feb. 9: No. 1, timothy New York \$27.50, Pittsburgh \$22, Cincinnati \$22, Chicago \$22, Memphis \$22; Kansas City \$14; No. 1, alfalfa Kansas City \$20.69, Chicago \$23; Memphis \$26; No. 1, prairie: Kansas City \$10.50, Chicago \$15.

Market inactive. Trades have no difficulty in filling orders; country buyers hesitant at current levels. Advance in corn has been helpful but moderate weather in principal feeding sections has created slightly easier feeling.

Offerings of wheat feeds by mills light for February, but good for March and April shipment. Cottonseed meal steady, sales of small volume. Linseed meal firm. Gluten fed and hominy feed quiet, prices unchanged.

Stocks quiet, movement fair. Quoted Feb. 9: Bran \$23.50, middlings \$23.50, flour middlings \$25.50, Minneapolis; 36 per cent. cottonseed meal \$34.50 Memphis; white hominy feed \$20.50 St. Louis; No. 1, alfalfa meal \$16.75 Kansas City.

Dairy Products Butter markets steady. Trading somewhat irregular with active demand limited to fancy goods. Foreign butter dull; offerings being made at as much as 3c lower than prices a week ago.

Closing prices 92 score: New York 37 1/2c, Chicago 36 1/2c, Philadelphia 37c, Boston 36 1/2c. Cheese markets showed a little steadier tone.

Trading in Wisconsin more active with good general demand in extreme East where demand is still largely for old cheese and where nearby production of fresh practically fills current requirements.

Closing prices at Wisconsin primary markets, Feb. 10: Twins 20 1/2c, Daisies 24 1/2c, Double Daisies 21c, Longhorns 21 1/2c, Square Prints 22c, Young Americas 21 1/2c.

Livestock and Meats Chicago hog prices advanced 60c to 85c during the week, heavy hogs advancing most. Beef steers generally steady, low priced cows firm to 15c higher; other grades and heifers unchanged.

Stockers and feeders mostly 25c higher; light veal calves generally 50c lower. Fat and feeding lambs advanced 50c to 75c and fat sheep and yearlings 25c to 50c per 100 lbs. Feb. 11 Chicago prices: Hogs, top \$10.26; bulk of sales \$9.60 to \$10.10; medium and good beef steers \$7 to \$9.15; butcher cows and heifers \$4.70 to \$4.75; feeder steers \$5.15 to \$7.10; light and medium weight veal calves \$7 to \$11; fat lambs \$12.75 to \$14.85; feeding lambs \$11.25 to \$13.25; yearlings \$10 to \$13.25; fat ewes \$7.75 to \$8.25.

Stocker and feeder shipments from 12 important markets during the week ending Feb. 4 were: Cattle and calves 45,010; hogs 5,485; sheep 28,681.

The trend of eastern wholesale freshmeat prices was downward. Veal ranged from \$1 to \$3 lower; mutton down \$1 to \$2; lamb down \$1; beef weak to 50c lower. Pork loins practically unchanged. Feb. 10 prices good grade meats: Beef \$11.50 to \$13; veal \$16 to \$19; lamb \$24 to \$26; mutton \$12 to \$14; light pork loins \$16 to \$18; heavy loins \$11 to \$14.

Fruits and Vegetables Chicago potato market stronger; most other cities weaker. New York sacked Round Whites down 25 to 30c in New York City at \$2.05 to \$2.15 per 100 lbs.; weaker in Philadelphia at \$2.15 to 2.40. Maine sacked Green Mountains down 10 to 15c in Eastern markets at \$2.15 to \$2.25. Northern Round White up 10c in

Chicago at \$1.70 to \$1.95. Colorado and Idaho Rurals steady in Chicago at \$2.25. Maine Green Mountains, in bulk, down 10c f. o. b. Northern Maine points at \$1.46 to \$1.56. New York sacked Round Whites weaker f. o. b. at 1.88 to 1.92. Northern stock slightly weaker f. o. b. at \$1.60 to \$1.75.

Celery prices declined at Florida shipping points; golden self-blanching stock down 40 to 50c at \$2.50 to \$2.62 per 10-inch crate. City markets show declines of 25c to 1 price reaching low point of \$3.25 to \$3.50 in Pittsburgh. California Golden Heart from cold storage \$9 to \$10 in Chicago.

Apple markets steady for barreled stock, firm for boxed stock. New York Baldwins held at \$7.50 to \$8 per barrel in city wholesale markets. Wire orders at shipping points \$7 to \$7.25. Michigan stock firm in Chicago at \$8 to \$8.50; few sales of Northwestern Extra Fancy boxed apples at \$2.75 to \$3.75. Auction sales in New York and Chicago \$2.50 to \$3.85.

Cabbage markets irregular. New York Danish type up \$2 to \$10 in Philadelphia at \$35 to \$43 per ton bulk. Northern stock firm in St. Louis at \$40 to \$45. Declines of \$8 to \$10 in other cities brought sales to \$35 to \$45. New York shipping points weaker at \$30 to \$32. Texas Early flat ruled \$5 weaker f. o. b. at \$15; firm in St. Louis at \$40 to \$45.
