According to the college workers, nearly all hogs have worms, especially during the early period of their lives. They usually become infested during the suckling and weaning period, and the ravages generally decrease as the hogs become older.

Sanitary premises, a liberal use of common disinfectants, and keeping the hogs in a thrifty condition are said to be among the very-heat preventives. It is also suggested that the following mineral mixture be kept before the hogs at all times: 30 pounds charcoal, 10 pounds ground limestone, 10 pounds salt, 1 pound sulfur and 1 pound copper sulfate.
