The work for 1921 has been briefly reviewed, showing not only what lines of work have been brought to a close during the year, but also the progress made along the many lines of investigation under way at the station. The development of new varieties of fruits thru selection and breeding, the working out of effective means for controlling insect and disease pests of fruits and vegetables, the study of dairy problems, the testing of seeds for purity and germination, these and numerous other activities engage the attention of the station experts and for the basis for the report.

NO BARGAINS IN SEEDS

The seedanalysis at the Experime Station at Geneva urges farmers and others purchasing seed to demand others purchasing seed to demand the best in quality and vigor as shown by purity and germination tests. Cheap seeds are cheap only because they are foul with weed seeds and of low germination, often being seed left over from the year before. The highest grade seeds are the cheapest in the end, according to the station

The seed testing labaratory at the experiment station is prepared to test seeds to be used for planting free of charge. These tests will show the state of the seeds to be used for planting free of charge. of charge. These tests will show the amount of seed that will germinate and the number of weet seem present. Those who contemplate having their seed tested by the station should send to Geneva for a copy of the rules regarding the free testing of seed which may be had upon re-
