—Fifty-four years ago the University of California was started with one small class. To-day the university is said to be the largest in the world, has grown to an establishment with an attendance in all its branches of 43,000.

—Brown & Bailey condenser are getting the non-pooled milk from Belmont these days. A large truck load is coming to Andover from that territory each day. They have also been buying from the Borden Company their Elm Valley milk.

—Hon. C. A. Farnum, of Wellsville, has presented to Allegany County his law library, which will be placed in the Court House at Belmont, for the benefit of those wishing to consult them. The library consists of between three and four thousand volumes carefully selected by the judge, and is a most generous gift.

—Clifford L. Grimm, at present principal of the Bolivar High School, has just been engaged to teach in the Portville High School the coming year. Merne Pritchard, teacher of music and drawing, and Marie Tolan, Bernice Olsen and Marjorie McDivitt, grade teachers, have also signed contracts to teach at Portville next year.

—The Whitcomb bill authorizing the admission of veterans of the World War to the state Soldiers' and Sailors' Homes, at Bath and Oxford, was approved April 14th by Governor Miller. The measure was supported by the American Legion, and the pen with which the Governor signed it will be presented to officials of the state department of the Legion.

—Mrs. Mary Williams, president of the Board of Education, of Hornell, was seriously injured last Monday while touring home from Orlando, Florida. The automobile was struck by a passenger train on a crossing near Henderson, North Carolina. Mrs. Williams had both arms fractured, leg and collar bone broken. A second member of the party, Mrs. Brundage, of Oneida, N. Y., was instantly killed.

—Herman Bierman, a former Wellsville man, now employed as foreman in the Standard Oil plant at Whiting, Ind., had a narrow escape when two stills loaded with about 20,000 gallons of crude gasoline exploded on the 14th of April. One man was instantly killed, three injured so severely that physicians claim they cannot live. Sixty gasoline stills were put out of commission and the plant damaged to the amount of \$300,000.
