WARRE STOCKMEN AGAINST FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE

A warning against the possibility of another outbreak of foot and mouth disease among livestock in New York comes from the State Agricultural College at Ithaca this week. It advises livestock men not to allow hay and straw used to pack imported crockery and other goods to come near susceptible animals.

Ohio farmers have found that those who have drilled corn during the past five years have averaged about a bushel an acre more yield than those who planted in hills.

This year's Farmers' Field Days at the State Agricultural College at Ithaca will be held on Thursday and Friday, June 22nd and 23rd, according to an announcement just made by the college. They are to be first of all a real old fashioned family picnic for everybody in the state.

A state-wide horseshoe tournament and other athletic events for both men and women have been arranged for the grown-ups. The older children will have a program of their own arranged by the state boys and girls club leader, and the ones too young to travel about will be kept happy and contented in a model nursery and play-ground presided over by members of the home economics staff.

Besides having a good time, visitors will have an opportunity to see the institution and its farms in the growing season and to talk with specialists about particular problems that interest them. The college says. Also most of the program has been arranged to take place out of doors, the two acres of open floor space in the state drill hall will be open throughout the two days as a place to eat luncheons and as general headquarters of the Field Days.
