TESTING MILKING MACHINE VALVES

Leakage May Prevent Production of High Grade Milk

A recent publication issued by the New York Agricultural Experiment Station at Geneva describes a simple method of testing the check valves on the pail lids of milking machines in order to determine whether foul material from the pipe line on which the machine is operated can pass down the connecting hose and enter the milker pail thus contaminating the milk.

To test the valve on the pail lid under normal conditions the dairyman is instructed to set up the machine in the usual way, first making sure that the milker pail is perfectly dry, and to attach the stanchion hose to a stopcock in the pipe line at a point where condensation water is known to accumulate.

Even properly constructed valves will not function as they should if they are allowed to become dirty and clogged, so the check valves should be cleaned after each milking, say the station workers.

DAIRY HERD GREATLY INFLUENCED BY SIRE

Pure Bred Bull's Valuable Asset

Figures recently issued by the dairy department of the Experiment Station at Geneva show the effect of the sire on the production of butter fat by his daughters and emphasizes the importance of selecting pure bred animals from high-producing parents to head the dairy herds of the state.

"The amount of milk any dairy herd may produce in the future is determined to a considerable extent by the kind of bull that is now in the herd," say the station experts.

Record of Station Herd Since 1900 the Experiment Station herd has consisted of pure bred Jerseys and production and feed records of all the cows have been carefully kept.

"These records emphasize the importance of careful selection of the bull and the value of using a bull that gets high-producing daughters as long as he can be of service in the herd."

MORE HEAVY RAINS HURT GRAIN CROPS

More damage to crops by flooding and washing was reported last week and corn and grain on the lowlands are suffering considerably from the effects of excessive moisture, according to the summary of weather and crop conditions for the week ending June 27, issued by the Ithaca office of the weather bureau.

Corn is backward and needs cultivation, warmth and sunshine. The weather has been favorable, however, for potatoes, grass and pasture, which are still further improved and in good to excellent condition.

POOLERS NOW MEMBERS OF CENTRAL ASSOCIATION

The Dairymen's League Co-Operative Association has amended its by-laws so that every pooler in the local associations can become a member of the central organization.

As a final step so that the Central Association may have a complete record of each pooler's application for membership, a return mailing card was recently sent to every member of the local association.

There has been some misunderstanding on the part of some dairymen in regard to the reference on the card to their individual liability of five dollars. Under the old by-laws, the individual liability of members in the Central Association was one hundred dollars, but when the by-laws were amended to admit all signers of local co-operative association by-laws as members of the central organization, the liability was reduced from one hundred dollars to five dollars per member.

OUTLOOK FOR VOIGHT BILL IS PROMISING

The outlook for passage by Congress of the Voight bill, which prohibits filled milk in interstate commerce, is excellent, officials of the New York State Farm Bureau Federation believe.

If the bill becomes a law, it will mark the end of one of the most strenuous fights ever put up by farmers to protect their interests. The Farm Bureau and practically every other farm organization has supported the bill thru thick and thin.

New York State passed a law at the session of the legislature prohibiting manufacture and sale of the imitation and bogus product. The State Farm Bureau Federation took a leading part in the fight for its passage.

DOGS All Dog Licenses Expire on June 30. The 1922 License Fee is Due July 1st

Every dog must wear a tag of the current dog license year. A dog without such a tag is not protected by law, and no action can be maintained for its injury or destruction.

License Fees are as Follows: Male dog \$2.25, Female dog 5.25, Spayed female dog 2.25

The assessors of towns and the police departments of cities are required to prepare in June of each year a list of dog owners.
