

From our host at the hotel in The Hague we learned a little of Holland's difficulties during the World War. The Dutch furnished Germany with milk in return for coal and often had little milk left for themselves. The people of Holland raise very few of the raw materials which their industries demand; they import most of these from the colonies. Thus, with shipping interrupted, work became scarce and prices soared. At present incomes as low as 2000 guiden (\$800) are taxed ahout 10%. Large incomes are taxed at much higher percentage.

No country in Europe attracted us as much as Holland for sturdiness of character and enterprise, for the placidness and quiet of its every-day country life. It was with profound regret that we said good bye to the Netherlands, and took the Channel steamer at the Hook of Holland, for England.
