# Farm and Stock Market

(Washington, D. C., for the week ending Dec. 11, 1922.)

### Live Stock and Meats

Chicago hog prices showed gains for the week amounting to 25-40c per 100 lbs. Beef cattle ranged from 10c lower to 15c higher, butcher heifers 25-40c up with butcher cows ranging from 85c lower to 25c higher, feeder steers advanced 15-25c and veal calves declined 25-50c for the week. Fat lambs steady to 15c higher, feeding lambs 25c net higher, while fat ewes were unchanged and yearlings were 25c net lower. On Dec. 11 hogs opened 10c higher, but closed weak and unevenly lower than Saturday's average. Beef steers steady to 15c lower, stockers and feeders steady to strong, other classes generally fat lambs fully steady, sheep steady to strong. Dec. 11 Chicago prices: Hogs, top, \$8.55; bulk of sales \$8.15-8.50 medium and good beef steers \$7.40-12; butcher cows and heifers \$3.25-11.15; feeder steers \$5.50-8; light and medium weight veal calves \$3.25-10; fat lambs \$13.25-15.50; feeding lambs \$12.50-14.75; yearlings \$3.50-13.25; fat ewes \$4.75-7.75. Stocker and feeder shipments from 12 important markets during the week ending Dec. 11 were: Cattle and calves 102,738; hogs 18,891; sheep 90,772. In eastern wholesale fresh meat markets beef ranged from \$1 lower to \$1 higher; veal strong to \$2 higher; lambs and mutton steady to \$1 higher with light pork loins \$1-2 lower and heavy loins generally \$1 lower for the week. On Dec. 11 beef was steady at Phila., \$1-1.50 higher elsewhere; under moderate receipts common veal \$1 higher at New York, other grades steady with all grades steady at other markets; lamb generally steady to strong; mutton steady on better grades, slightly higher on common and medium; pork about \$1 higher at Phila., generally steady elsewhere. Dec. 11 prices good grade meats: Beef \$15-17; veal \$14-19; lamb \$23-28, mutton \$11-17; light pork loins \$16-18; heavy loins \$12-16.

### Dairy Products

Butter markets steady to firm. Factor of greatest interest now is imports which have caused an unsettled feeling. Chicago and New York still out of line with each other; Chicago is now receiving some butter ordinarily shipped to New York. Closing prices, 92 score butter: New York

84c; Phila. 85 1/2c; Boston 84c; Chicago 85 1/2c. Cheese markets firm but trading is slow, partly due to usual seasonal dullness. Wisconsin production holding up remarkably well. Movement of goods from stor-

age light. Dealers view general situation with confidence. Cheese prices at Wisconsin Primary markets, Dec. 9: Twines 25 1/2c; Daisies 27 1/2c; Double Daisies 27c; Longhorns 27 1/2c; Square Prints 27 1/2c.
