**TO FIGHT BOVINE
 TUBERCULOSIS**

**Allagany County Dairymen May
 Have Free Tests Conducted**

The prevention and control of
 tuberculosis, both among humans and
 livestock, has become a source of
 considerable interest both to the
 public and the dairymen during the
 past few years. As a public health
 measure and in order that the cattle
 of Allegany County be clean from
 Bovine Tuberculosis, the Board of
 Supervisors at their recent session
 passed a resolution to appropriate
 the sum of five thousand dollars for
 two supervisors, John Isaman, of
 Grove, and S. B. Tuttle, of Scio, were
 appointed to act in connection with

a committee from the Farm Bureau
 Association to supervise the expendi-
 ture of money appropriated for tuber-
 culosis eradication and to co-operate
 with the U. S. Bureau of Animal In-
 dustry and the New York State De-
 partment of Farms and Markets.

No definite plans for carrying on
 the work have been completed as yet.
 However, the Farm Bureau Associa-
 tion have made the following plans
 and recommendations.

Beginning January 1st, all cattle
 will be tested free and subject to
 both State and Federal indemnity.

One or more men will be appointed
 in each township to get applications
 for the test signed by all farmers in
 their particular township.

The work will be carried on in
 townships in order to facilitate the
 handling of reactors and to cut down

traveling expense of veterinarians
 and appraisers. The town sending in
 the largest number of applications
 by January 1st will receive the first
 testing on the township basis.

All reactors will be loaded and
 shipped from local points farmers
 receiving in addition to Federal and
 State indemnities the salvage or car-
 casses condemned. The indemnity
 received by a reactor depends on the
 sale value and condition of the ani-
 mal when appraised. For grades the
 state indemnity is any amount up to
 \$67.50 and for purebreds up to
 \$112.50. The Federal indemnity is
 any amount not to exceed \$25.00 for
 grades and \$50.00 for purebreds.
