Farmers especially should awake to the country's forest heeds. One-third of all our forest lands is in the form of-farm woodlots and small holdings. Farmers also are the greatest single class of wood-users.

Here in Andover the most casual observer has seen the way forest land has been cut over. Hundreds upon hundreds of trees are cut out annually and none is planted to take their place.

The problem of our diminishing forests will never be solved by state and federal agencies. It is one for every land owner to consider most seriously.
