

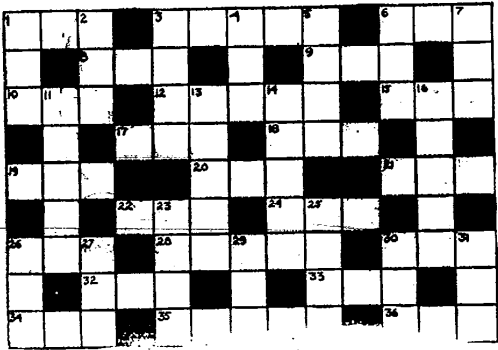
THIS WEEK'S CROSS WORD PUZZLE

Country Veals Steady Live Poultry Lower Although receipts of country-dressed calves have been light the demand is only fair and the market unchanged from last week.

Hay Receipts Light, Market Steady The hay market is steady under light receipts. U. S. Timothy No. 1 closed at \$25.00 a ton.

Farm and Stock Market

Chicago hog prices 15c lower to 5c higher than a week ago, closing at \$12.25 for the top and \$11.70-12.10 for the bulk. Medium and good beef steers steady to 15c higher at \$8.50-11.35; butcher cows and heifers steady to 15c lower at \$4.25-11.25; feeder steers steady at \$5.00-11.25; light and medium weight veal calves 50c-\$1 higher at \$8.50-11.50.

Grain Markets irregular with easier tone. Wheat futures mixed, slightly higher to slightly lower than week ago. Cash wheat irregular with soft winters firm but hard winters lower.

Feed offerings increased and markets are easier. Wheat feeds in particularly good supply especially for 30-day shipment but buyers show little interest.

Oil meals dull and offered steadily despite heavier production. Export demand for high protein feeds light.

Stocks and bond markets were mixed. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed at 200.12.

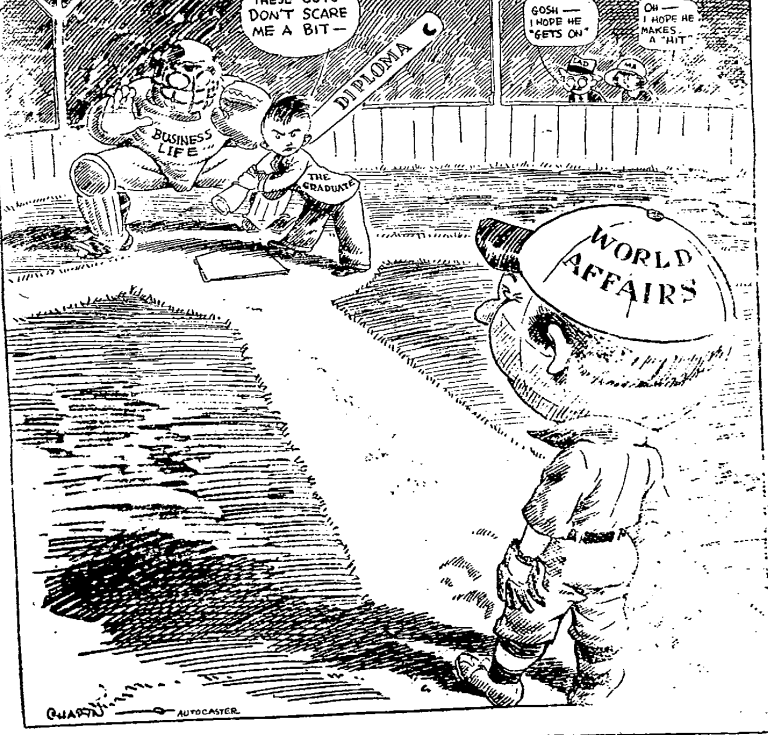

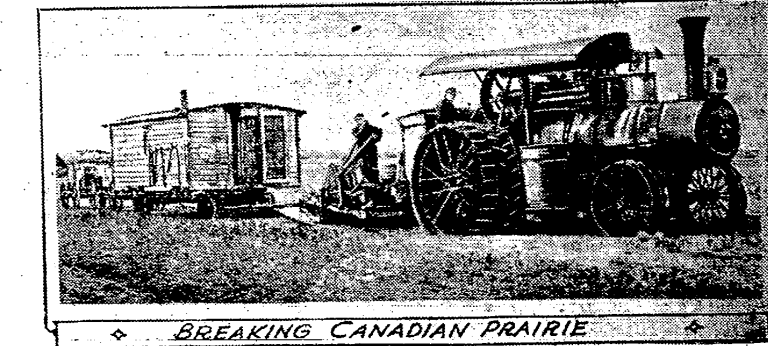
