



HIGHLIGHTS ON STATE CROPS

From New York State Dept. Farms and Markets Sept. 29, 1925.

Butter and Eggs Advance

The butter and egg market continued to advance this week with each day's prices higher, says the Department of Farms & Markets. Latest prices are: Creamery salted butter, higher score, 52-52 1/2; 92 score 51 1/2. Nearby henry white eggs closed at 65-66¢ for average extras and 55-62¢ for extra firsts; nearby henry browns fancy to extra fancy 58-66¢. The best grade of gathered whites sold at 48-69¢. Cheese closed at 24-24 1/2¢ per pound for fresh average-run flats.

Fancy Cauliflower Wanted

Fancy cauliflower was in demand early this week, owing to limited receipts from the Catskill Mountain section. Prices ranged from \$1.50-\$3.50 per crate. Long Island supplies were more liberal and prices ranged from 75¢-\$3.50 per crate.

Other Vegetables

Western New York carrots were in good demand on Tuesday with supplies plentiful. The market closed firm with prices for washed at \$1.15-1.25 per 32-quart basket and unwashed 75-81¢. Catskill Mountain Brussels sprouts brought 14-22¢ per quart on Tuesday; cabbage \$15-20 per ton for white Danish; celery \$1.25-1.75 per two-thirds crate; lettuce 50¢-52.75 per crate; tomatoes 50-75¢ per 12-quart basket.

Pears and Grapes Firm

The demand for good, large, fancy pears was good and the supply of Bartletts, Clapps Favorites and Seckels was liberal with prices ranging from \$2.50-2.75 per bushel on Tuesday. Hudson Valley and Central New York Concord grapes were selling for 85-90¢ per 12-quart basket.

Peach Market Steady

Western New York Elberta peaches were in fairly liberal receipts Tuesday. The quality was very irregular, which was reflected in the price, which ranged from 50¢-52.50 per bushel.

Demand for Fancy Apples

Apples were in abundant supply

early this week, but only the fanciest quality found a ready market with ordinary and poor findings scarcely any sale and clogging the market. A 2 1/2 inch Rhode Island Greenings brought \$4.5 and McIntoshes \$5-\$7.50 per barrel.

Calves and Poultry Steady

Under a light supply and steady demand country-dressed calves continued steady early this week. Latest prices are: Choice 23-24¢ per pound; fair to good 19-22¢; common and small 15-18¢.

The live poultry market opened steady after the Jewish holiday with colored fowls at 26-30¢; leghorns 20-23¢; chickens 27¢ per pound.

Hay Steady

Due to lighter receipts, the hay market has continued steady. U. S. timothy No. 1 brought \$29-30 per ton; No. 2, \$27-28; No. 3, \$24-26; Sample \$15-21.

Potato markets slightly weaker. New York and Pennsylvania sacked round whites mostly \$2.10-2.15 per 100 pounds in eastern cities; \$1.90-1.95 f.o.b. Northern. Northern sacked round whites \$1.85-1.95 f.o.b. sales in Chicago; \$1.68-1.80 f.o.b. Virginia sweet potatoes advanced at \$4.50-5 per barrel in city markets; \$4.25-4.50 f.o.b. eastern shore points. Apples market dull. New York Wealthlys \$1-1.25 per bushel basket; northwestern Greenings and Kings \$4.4-5.00 per barrel. Delaware Grimes fancy, at \$5. Illinois Jonathans \$6-6.75 in Chicago. New York cabbage steady to stronger. Domestic type ranged \$15-25 bulk per ton in eastern market and \$8-12 f.o.b. Rochester. Prices of New York Elberta peaches dropped 25-75¢ per bushel basket in most consuming centers, wholesale prices on this variety ranged \$1.50-2.50.

Grain market very weak. Heavy movement of Canadian wheat with lower quotations for Argentine and Russian wheat in European market principal cause of weakness in wheat market. Cash grain selling at steady premiums over futures. Prospective early movement of corn and large stocks of oats forcing feed grains to lower levels. Quoted Sept. 28. Feed

The feed market continues weak with prices slightly lower. Canadian bran and middlings both being offered in eastern markets slightly under domestic quotations. Buying in small lots and only to meet immediate requirements. Quoted Sept. 28: Minneapolis spring wheat bran \$22.50; Standard middlings \$25.50; 14% linseed meal \$42.50; Chicago gluten feed \$39.30; yellow hominy feed \$29. Memphis 36% cotton seed meal \$34; 60% digester feeding tankage at various shipping markets \$65.

Live Stock and Meats

Despite a drop of 25-50c in the Chicago hog market today the top prices was around 35c higher than a week ago, the bulk 15-20c higher, bulk of beef steers 25¢ beef steers 25¢ higher, spots up more, cows and heifers 25-50c lower, fat lambs steady to 15c lower. Fresh meats (Western dressed) New York wholesale market is higher on good grade steer beef, veal, lamb and mutton than a week ago. Pork loins are steady to 1/2¢ higher. September 28 quotations on good grade meats: Steer beef, \$19-22; veal \$22-24; lamb \$27-29; mutton \$15-17; light pork loins \$34-35; heavy loins \$23-27.

Dairy Products

Butter markets very firm during the week. Supplies of fancy firm somewhat limited, resulting in asking prices being firmly held. Storage butter beginning to move in a larger way. Some concern as to effect of high prices upon demand, but so far there has apparently been no reaction. Foreign markets continue firm with prices such as to preclude possibility of imports. Closing prices on 92 score: New York 51c; Chicago 50c; Phila. 52c; Boston 51c. Cheese markets firm and higher. Generally felt that while advances have been sharp, demand will fully absorb all available goods before season is over. High butter markets a supporting factor also. Wholesale prices on Wisconsin primary markets Sept. 28: Twins 23c; Single Daisies 23 1/2c; Longhorns 23 1/2c; Square Prints 24c.
