

In 1915 there were more deaths from measles than um automobile accidents; in 1925 the death rate for e latter exceeded the measles rate approximately Ten years ago the combined death rate for the four principal communicable diseases of childhood was about seven times as high as that for automobile accidents, and diphtheria alone caused four times as many deaths as did the motor vehicle; but in 1925, the number of deaths from all four diseases combined does not greatly exceed the death toll of the automobile; and the latter now kills three persons to diphtheria's two.

These facts make it more imperative for parents to teach their children the great danger to them in the motor vehicle and urge constant vigilance. Some responsibility also rests on the automobile driver who hould use the utmost precaution, particularly in school


