

In the future, when licenses have been denied auilists, or when the right to drive has been revoked by duly authorized public officials, the persons thus affected will be unable to obtain automobile insurance! thru any of the principal casualty and surety companies which comprise the National Bureau.

Motor vehicle commissioners in different states will furnish immediately to the National Bureau the names of all persons whose licenses have been revoked. This information will immediately be distributed to the companies, and further insurance to reckless drivers will be refused and existing insurance will be cancelled. It is an established fact, say the Bureau officials, that many serious accidents are caused by criminal and careless motorists who continue to operate even after

their licenses have been revoked for good cause. Insurance carried by an irresponsible and reckless driver simply makes him more careless. 


