

Unconscious Influence

I was using a well known household article when my friend

"Why did you buy that kind?" she asked.

"Because it's good," I replied.

She asked me why. Without realizing what I was doing I gave her several technical reasons for the superiority of that machine. I enumerated a number of its mechanical advantages and one or more special conveniences that I felt meant much to me.
