TIDBITS

Simplified Athletic Contests for Andover Boys This is an all-round point scoring contest devised by George O. Draper, for rural and village schools and has distinctive features, one of the best being that smaller boys can compete with larger ones on a com-

parative scoring basis. The boys are classified into four groups as follows: Class 1-Boys under 14 years

weighing under 81 pounds.

Class 2.—Boys under 14 years, weighing 81 pounds or over, and boys of 14 and 15 who are under Class 3.—Boys 14 and 15 years

old weighing 96 pounds and over, and boys of 16 and 17 weighing under 111 pounds. Class 4.—Boys of 16, 17 and 1' weighing 111 pounds and over.

Rules and Instructions: The weight of the contestants is , taken with coat, vest and hat within one week of the contest. Do not use freations in scoring. If the record falls between the numbers of the scoring table give him

the next highest point. When a boy exceeds a record give him one extra point as follows: For three inches in the standing broad jump; for nine inches in the running broad jump; for two inches in the high jump; for ten feet in the ten-second run; for ten feet in the baseball throw, for two extra pull-

The standard rules are used except in the ten-second run. In this' mark off zones every ten feet from the 100 yard mark for some dis- 18. R. Tuttle tance. Each runner is timed for ten seconds and his points are determined by the zone he is in at the end of the ten seconds. The score of each class competing is determined by adding the points' made by each contestant and dividing by the number who are eligible to compete. This is to encourage everyone to compete who is able.
