The Ohio experiment station finds that the late Irish Cobbler, which was developed in New York State, equalled the Russet Rural in yield.

The second annual incubation school is scheduled at Cornell University Dec. 28 to 30. Artificial incubation of game birds is to be discussed, in addition to hatching domestic fowls.

According to the standard set in the Cornell poultry calendar, bulletin F 186, a hen should lay two eggs in November and a pullet should lay six eggs. Similar standards are suggested for each month so poultrymen may know if the flock is laying at a satisfactory rate. This combined bulletin and account book is free on request to the office of publication of the New York State College of Agriculture at Ithaca, N. Y.

"Black Magic" Practice Popular in Old France

Charlatanism, sorcery and black magic concentrating in the terrific holocaust epitomized by the Marquis de Sade, carried on right into the bloody hours of the French revolution. A French sorceress, Catherine Monvoisin, known as "La Voisin," was much patronized by the great ladies of Montespain's time, with somewhat the same object as de Montespain, love, riches, avarice, hatred. La Voisin, clever woman that she was, soon got wealthy with her philters and witchcraft.

Her fame, of course, drew de Montespain, who along with a few minor episodes such as black mass celebrations, got embroiled in the famous "affaire des poisons," in which Montespain plotted with La Voisin to poison Louis XIV. The plot caused such a scandal that Louis closed the court. La Voisin was executed early in the case and de Montespain got off through influence. Later, strangely enough, after she went into retirement, she became so good as to come near sainthood.

Madame de Montespain was quite a generous patron of letters and she set the styles for clothes as well as decoration. She was born in 1641, died, 1707.

Typhoons and Cloud-bursts

Typhoons have produced some of the world's most remarkable cloud burst floods, writes Charles Fitzhugh Talman in Asia Magazine. Perhaps the most disastrous cloudburst on record was the one that occurred in the Kii peninsula of southern Japan on August 16, 1880, during the passage of a typhoon. The resulting flood drowned 1,500 persons and caused immense destruction of property. A typhoon also brought the heaviest 24-hour rainfall ever measured, on July 14-15, 1911, when 46 inches of water fell from noon to noon at Baguio, the summer capital of the Philippines, starting huge landslides that buried portions of the famous Benquet road. But a second typhoon repaired some of the damage wrought by the first; for it washed away most of the debris, including, it is said by \$250,000, the cost of rebuilding the road.

"Hejira" in History

"Hejira" is an Arabic word meaning departure. It is applied specifically to the flight of Mohammed from Mecca in 622 A. D., a date which was afterwards fixed as the beginning of the Moslem era in the Mohammedan calendar. Frequently "hejira" is used figuratively for any flight or exodus regarded as being like that of Mohammed. The word is pronounced either "hejira" with the first syllable accented, or "hejira," with the accent on the second syllable.

Tree Protectors

Poison bait is the best protection against mice in sod orchards but where a small number of trees are to be protected, they may be wrapped with newspaper, burlap or building paper, wood veneer, or galvanized hardware cloth, says Professor Joseph Oskamp of the New York State college of agriculture. Wire wrappers are the most expensive but may be left on the tree for several years. The galvanized screen of one-fourth or one-half inch mesh can be bought in rolls 18 inches wide. The strips may be cut wide enough to provide for the tree's growth, and fastened around the tree with clinched hog rings.
