## IMMEDIATE REDUCTIONS RESIDENTIAL COMMERCIAL ELECTRIC RATES

411 'room count' rates now eliminated

As the first step in a new program of reductions to be made by the Niagara, Lockport and Ontario Power Company residential and commercial customers in the Cattaraugus District will immediately receive reduced and simplified electric rates. The new rates, filed for approval by the Public Service Commission, will mean an annual saving to Niagara, Lockport and Ontario Power Company customers of approximately \$120,000.

Since 1929, rate reductions made by this company total approximately \$500,000. The last of these reductions, made only last year to customers in the Cattaraugus District, affected saving of nearly \$13,000.

The new simplified rates are in accord with the company's recent announcement of "yardstick" rates designed to approach, as closely as the cost of service will permit, the low rates now enjoyed by Buffalo and the densely populated Niagara Frontier area.

The main feature of the new reduced rate program, as it affects residential customers, is the complete elimination of the "room-count" electric rate. Hereafter householders will pay on a simple block rate basis for the electricity they use, regardless of the size of their homes.

New Low Regidential Rates

The new pot residential rate for the villages of Cattaraugus, Franklinville, the present "demand" or "connected Limestone, Portville and Cuba and the load" basis. This means eliminating hamlets of Allentown, West Valley, Collins Center, Otto, East Otto, Farmersville Station, Hinsdale, Whitesville. Ischua, Machias, Black Creek and Scio is as follows:

\$1.00 for the first 12 kilowatt-hours or less per month.

4½c for each of the next 48 kilowatt

2½c for each of the next 140 kilowatt

1½c per kilowatt-hour for the balance

New Low Commercial Rates

Benefits of the new schedule of commercial rates are extended to the entire Cattaraugus District as follows:

7c for each of the first 50 kilowatthours per month.

5½c for each of the next 50 kilowatt-

5c for each of the next 500 kilowatt-

2½c per kilowatt-hour for the balance

As in the case of residential customers. the new commercial schedule is based on a simplified block rate in place of the demand inventory, and also offers a two cent reduction in the top step of

Low Cost Electricity in Every Home

With improving economic conditions and lower rates it is hoped that our customers will use still more electricity, thus making further rate reductions

We believe the program now being undertaken represents a practical and co-operative step toward the objective so generally sought throughout the nation: that is, a full and unrestricted use of electricity in the homes of all the people at the lowest possible cost.
