The Window Seat

Washington, D. C.—To My Million and More Readers: Washington, politically, is agitated right now about the adverse reports...

You see we all of us have been talking, and the papers have been full of stories, about the unemployment, and the relief rolls and the things of that sort.

This army of employed have not had, as a rule, much increase in wages. Some of the lowest paid have gotten more wages, but on the whole there has not been much of an increase.

The employed man and woman have suffered severely as a result. They had a hard job making both ends meet previously, and then when living costs jump up it makes them do a lot of scratching.

What makes the increased cost of living? One thing, and I believe it is an important factor, is the drought. Another thing, is the NRA with its codes, which have eliminated a lot of the kind of competition which used to make lower living costs.

I am inclined to think President Roosevelt is about as much concerned at this immediate time, and from the political viewpoint, over these high living costs, as he is about almost anything else.

But I don't think he needs to be seriously worried about being re-elected next year, so far as one can tell this far in advance.
