difficult and tricky to make-but it's really very simple. Chocolate Pinwheel Cookies 11/2 cups sifted flour: 1/2 teaspoor double-acting baking powder; teaspoon salt: ½ cup butter other shortening; 1/2 cup sugar; 1 egg yolk, unbeaten; 3 tablespoon milk: 1 square unsweetened choco-

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Cream butter thoroughly, add sugar gradually, and cream together ur til light and fluffy. Add egg you and beat well. Add flour, alternate! with milk, mixing well after each addition. Divide dough in two parts. To one part, add chocolate and blend. Chill until firm enough to roll. Roll each half into rectangular . ¼ inch thick, and place chocolate sheet on top. Then roll as for jelly roll. Chill overnight, c until firm enough to slice. Cut 1/4-inch slices. Bake on ungreased baking sheet in hot oven (400° F minutes, or until done. Makes 3½ dozen pir
