A .- They are: Homicide or sault arising out of the operation of a motor vehicle or motor cycle, criminal negligence in the operation of a motor vehicle or a motor cycle resulting in death; speeding of reckless driving where injury or property damage results therefrom; leaving the scene of an accident; driving while intoxicated, or driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquors in another state.
