





Instructed to Take License Numbers of Motorists Who Disregard the Law.

Many Allegany county motorists are either unacquainted with the Andover, the drivers have reported the license numbers of six cars that have failed to obey the law. For the information of Andover drivers the following explanation of the school bus law is given.
