INSTRUCTIONS FOR VULTING ON THE CURTAIN MACHINES.

1st.—Swing the handle of the Curtaining Lever (overhead) around to the right as far as it will go, and leave it there. This will close the curtain around you and unlock the machine for vulting.

2nd.—To set on the apparatus, turn down a number over either

"YES" or "NO," and proceed in the same manner in case there are often propositions to be voted on in your town.

3rd. At the left end of the machine (in column 1) you will find the party candidates for Chief Justice of the Court of Appeals. Turn down the party candidate for Chief Justice of the Court of Appeals, and turn it down

pointed over the Party candidate you want to vote for AND LEAVE IT DOWN.
Leave it in column 5, turn down the pointer over the name of the candidate you wish to vote for Justice of the Supreme Court, and leave it down.

Keep on in the same manner to the end of the ticket, taking care to turn down a pointer for every office AND LEAVES THEM DOWN.

A FEW WORDS OF EXPLANATION.
Each candidate's "Poumer" is located just above his name; so be sure to turn down the Poumer ABOVE the name of the candidate you wish to vote for.
I leave all Poumers DOWN. If you wish them back you have not voted.

--The voting machine will push them back as you ring the curtain handle to go out. No one knows how you have voted when you leave the machine.

The machine is so arranged that you cannot start
the proper number of punches for any other. Therefore, you have no

elected, you can turn down the proper number of punches, say three in
