Mrs. Hayden Rogers was the winner in the contest closing November 18th with her recipe for hot molasses cake which follows, with Mildred Nye, Mrs. John Briggs, Leeman Davis and Mrs. Clayton as runners-up:

Hot Molasses Cake

1 cup shortening
1/2 teaspoon soda
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 egg
1/2 teaspoon allspice
1 cup Brer Rabbit molasses
1 teaspoon cinnamon
2 cups flour
1/2 cup milk
1 teaspoon baking powder
Cream shortening well,
add sugar, beating continuously,
beaten egg, beat well, add
half of flour, baking
soda and spices, which
been sifted together; add
remainder of dry ingredients
well. Bake in greased shallow
pan in hot oven at 425 degrees
20 minutes. Serve hot with
whipped cream or chocolate
sauce.

Molasses Spice Cookies

1 cup shortening
Two-thirds cup sugar
1 cup molasses
1/4 cup sour milk
2 1/2 cups flour
2 teaspoons soda
1 teaspoon ginger
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon allspice
1/4 teaspoon cloves
1/2 cup chopped dates.
Cream shortening, add sugar and cream together well and light. Add molasses and mix thoroughly. Sift together times all dry ingredients together with dates, mix well. Chill. Roll out dough and thin. Bake on greased cookie sheet eight minutes. Moderate degrees F. Makes about 4 dozen.
