The legend doubtless arose from the fact that many snakes, canni bal-like, feed on their young or the iyoung of any other snakes indis-). criminately so that if their own young come around at the right time at the psychological moment, so to speak, they will eat them as food. They are, however, never able to disgorge them. When the little snake reaches the interior of the larger snake, it is very badly out of luck because the digestive organs of h snake's stomach are particularly active and they immediately begin to dissolve the young snake. It has no more chance than a lump of sugar would have in a cup of hot cof-

Another fact that has seemed t give credence to this legend is the fact that the young of this particular water snake, as well as those of). many others, are hatched from the 'egg in the uterus of the mother and \ undergo considerable development before they are born.
