





President Roosevelt has urged the American people to rededicate themselves on the coming 4th of July to "defend and perpetuate those inalienable rights which found true expression" in the Declaration of Independence.

In a formal statement the President asked the people to participate in a celebration on that day which is being planned by the office of civilian defense. His statement follows:


