
required following an accident, the motor vehicle in question cannot again be registered in this state by action is pending and no judgment, anyone unless requirements of the law are first met by the person whose license was suspended.

This means that if a person sells his car, or transfers it to another member of his family or anyone else, after losing his registration privileges for any of the reasons named, the new owner will not be

(1) a receiver in bankruptcy or a trustee in bankruptcy appointed under the laws of the United States; (2) the holder of a lien or mortgage upon the car, taken before Januar, 1, 1942, or any person claiming title from such lien holder or mortgagee and (3) a judgment debtor who has recovered a judgment in any action resulting from the accident on ac-count of which the vehicle's regis-

tration was suspended.

Another provision of the states that when the owner of a motor vehicle, who is required to give proof of future financial re-sponsibility, files a certificate showing that any car or cars owned by him are insured, but that he is not insured while driving another's car, it will be unlawful for him to operate a vehicle owned by anyone be-
