Facts Pertaining To Auto Tire Rationing

Erwin D. Baker, Erwin Lewis and R. J. Soot Appointed Tire Rationing Board in Andover.

Last week the Andover board appointed Erwin Baker, Erwin Lewis and R. J. Soot members of the Tire Rationing Board for the Town of Andover. At a later meeting Reginald Grant was elected chairman and the meeting of the Tire Rationing Board held on Monday, Jan. 5th, at the place Alwin Schaller of chairman of the Allegany Defense Council and Allegany Tire Administrator, explained the duties of the various Tire Rationing Boards. The session lasted several hours and the quota for each county for the month was announced.

It was pointed out that only so many tires to be used and it now appears that there are no tires for the ordinary use, and that unless you have a visiting nurse or a doctor, it will be practically impossible to obtain a tire or privately owned automobile. It was pointed out at the meeting that rationing boards should set up a schedule of tires and give publicity to it and place for the filing of tires approved by the tire rationing board.

In Andover it has been the meetings of the tire rationing board will be held in the law office of R. J. Soot, West Greenwood street this Thursday of each week at 7:30 p. m., but that if any emergency arises where a person to a tire or tube finds he needs the Andover board to hold an emergency meeting to pass on the application.

The Andover quota of tires for the month of January is as follows:

- Two tires and two tubs for passenger cars, motorcycles, trucks, five tires and four heavy trucks and buses.
- Readily seen that there may be many tires or tubes to be rationed.
- The process by which a person will obtain a tire or tube is the individual must apply for a rationing card, which forms it is believed will be issued by the Southern law office, and also at the tire rationing board.
- The application to take the tire rationing card will be inspected by the tire rationing board, whether or not it can be retroceded or recapped, a case that it cannot be treated or recapped, he must apply for it to the tire rationing board.
- The applicant will then receive a certificate which will be valid until the tire rationing board is notified of the tire rationing card.
- However, as yet the board has not received application forms so the board will be glad to receive application if they will mail J. Sootheran, chairman.
- Federal Regulations Governing the Purchase of New Tires and Tubes. Purchase certificates may not be issued until certain conditions are met. The certificate "will be mounted on tires for professional use only."
- Vehicles used by surgeons, visiting nurses, and other persons, principally for medical services.
- Ambulances.
- Vehicles used for fire fighting services, and for police services, and for specific laws affecting safety, garbage re-
