Her hobbies are mainly tennis, bridge and when she is home attending plays as she lives near a large theatre.

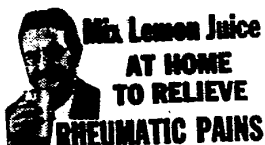
