quires only that the sportsman carry with him his furlough papers or a copy of the order granting the leave of absence and his service identification tag. The Conservation Law was

changed two years ago to permit issuance of citizen-resident fishing licenses to soldiers, sailors and marines stationed in this state, and this act amends this to take in hunting, trapping and special deer licenses, making applicable to all persons "in the armed forces.'
