

The answer to both parts of that question is definitely-NO. The reorganization prescribed by General Drum is merely to make ready for an orderly establishment of the new National Guard when the War Department de-cides just what that new portion of our defense forces will consist of. Actually, the changeover may require more than a year after the War Department directive is issued. That means the present Guard must remain in existence for at least twelve months, probably longer. It is the only armed military force within the Empire State, and its |present functions are probably more important than they ever were at any time during war.

The Guard is at this time urgently in need of 4,000 men, ablebodied citizens between the ages of 17 and 55 are eligible.
