warms up the mercury to provide sufficient mercury vapor to carry the current. As soon as the current can flow thru the length of the tube, invisible ultra-violet! light is produced. The phosphors! on the tube wall absorb this ultra-violet light and fluoresce or glow with different colors, depending on the chemical nature of the phosphor.

Fluorescent lights are much efficient than ordinary lamps, because in the latter a large percentage of the electric current is wasted in heat. A 25watt fluorescent tube produces a guest Sunday of Mr. and Mrs. tungsten light and is cool enough to hold in the hand. It is often referred to as cold light.—Dr. Aden King.
