This, plus the fact that the meat industry has been tied up with a strike, adds up to one thing; now is the time to use eggs liberally. Remember that an egg lis just about as nutritious a package of food as anyone can obtain. ~-

Buy eggs according to grade. Grade A are high quality eggs suitable for any purpose. Grade B are good quality eggs suitable for scrambling and general cookling. Grade C, the lowest grade sold in New York, are good eggs suitable for wholesome dishes where egg cooking in Asvor does not predominate. Sometimes ungraded eggs are sold as Grade C, and may be equal to Grade A in quality. Keep eggs in the refrigerator. Tasty Treat

When youngsters come in from an afternoon or evening of outdoor fun, they'll be looking for food. And nothing will taste better than sandwiches and a hot drink. Here's something you might try serving ribbon sandwiches. Put three or more slices of bread together with a soft filling between the slices. Use white and dark bread alternate-
