That increased exports played a business activity and strong markets for farm products is revealed by figures on foreign trade recently released by the department of commerce. The value of domestic exports increased from 3.1 billion dollars in 1939 to 14.1 billion dollars in 1944, or by nearly five times.

Most of this increase reflected lend-lease operations of the government, for out of total exports in 1944, 11.3 billion dollars were financed by lend-lease and only 2.8 billion dollars were handled otherwise. Thus non-lend-lease exports in 1944 were lower than the total in 1939.
