Better Drying Finishes Made From Explosive Base

Harder and quicker drying finishes are being made from a powerful explosive base. Pentaerythritol, when nitrated, has long been recognized as a super-high explosive. More recently it was found to improve both oils and resins for surface coatings. Close chemical relatives are formed in the manufacture of pentaerythritol and are usually present in the commercial prod-

Although pentaerythritol had been used in industrial explosives and plasticizers, its big chance came early in the war when tung and perilla oils, imported from the Far East, were cut off. Fast and harddrying oils were essential for varnish, paint, enamel, printing ink and linoleum, and every effort was made to improve drying properties and film characteristics of the slower and softer-drying domestic linseed and soybean oils.

-Plants that root deep, including trees and some grasses, are important agents in enriching the surface soil. The deep-ranging roots draw from the deeper layers of the soil various plant nutrients, particuto the soil, but are concentrated in Otsego, ing plants can draw on them. There are wide differences in the quantity of organic matter that can be returned to the soil under various conditions. It is estimated that natural soils produce annually something less than a ton to the acre of dry organic matter in semi-arid grassert, the production would be small, but not insignificant.
