Lundberg Will Run Independent

Carl W. Lundberg of Westons Mills, defeated by Rep. Daniel A. Reed of Dunkirk for the Republican nomination for Congress from the 45th District, has announced that he will enter the general election in November as an independent candidate for the office.

"I am deeply impressed by the size of the protest vote against Mr. Reed's attempt to perpetuate himself," Mr. Lundberg said in a prepared statement issued shortly after the Primary. "I have been urged to continue my efforts to unseat him, and can now place myself in position to win the support of members of all parties."

Mr. Lundberg declares he will head an independent ticket composed of veterans for all offices, petition for which will be circulated soon. Independent candidates for member of Congress, state senator and assemblymen are required to file petitions with the secretary of state at Albany before September 7, and aspirants to county offices with the county election board not later than that date.


