making special efforts to assure registration of Greene of Railroad Valley. all fully automatic firearms, including the large number of such weapons which were brought to this country as trophies from overseas.

The National Firearms Act of 1934 requires registration with the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, Washington, D. C., of all fully automatic firearms such as machine guns and machine pistols. No difficulty was encountered in enforcing the Act prior to the influx of war souvenir firearms during 1944-45. Since that time, however, many of these dangerous weapons have already found their way into the hands of the criminal element and have been used in the commission of crimes of violence, such as robberies and murders. These guns represent a great potential hazard to the safety of their possessors as well as to effective law enforcement.

Your Government is making strenuous efforts to cope with this situation by urging the owners of fully automatic firearms to register them.

If you possess a fully automatic firearm which has not been registered, contact the nearest office of the Alcohol Tax Unit of the Bureau of Internal Revenue, or write to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, Washington, D. C., and a representative will register your firearm without cost at your convenience.
