No home is safe from tuberculosis until every home

You can find out what tuberculosis prevention and control measures are being carried out by the tuberculosis association and the health department in your community. You can get periodic chest x- RADIO-PHONOGRAPH rays yourself. You can urge your friends and neigh-!' bors to do likewise. You would then not only protecting yourself but also helping to further the control of tuberculosis, a disease which kills 53,000 Americans a year.


