Sleeping Potion for Potatoes

A "sleeping potion" for tatees to reduce : sprouting storage is one of the more recent scientific developments now available for housewives. The result of research conducted by Cornell University, the new chemical was used on more than 600,000 bushels last year by large growers. It is called methyl ester and is now available in dust form one pound containers for the small grower who produces for home use, and for the housewife who stores potatoes in large quantity.

To keep that high quality, however, the corn should be used as quickly as possible after it is purchased or harvested and should not be husked until just a few minutes before cooking. If the corn must be held for even a short time before cooking, it should be stor-1 ed at a temperature near 32 de-1 grees F. to retard the loss of sugar.


