Of course, the real difficulty is not with the child's muscles but with the nerves that control them. These are located in the brain. All convulsions, therefore, should be looked upon as evidences of irritation or disturbance in some part of the brain. In small children, a high fever in itself may be enough to precipitate a single convulsion which never recurs.

If the child has a high fever at ATLANTIC SERVICE the time of a convulsion, an alcohol rub may help to bring his fever down to around 101-102 degrees. Equal parts of water and alcohol are best. Even the cooling effect of water alone rubbed over the exposed skin to encourage evaporation may help. Don't worry if your doctor cannot come as soon as you call. Probably, by the time he arrives,






