Farm Deferment Regulations

Wallace J. Wingert, Chairman taken place recently that will greatly effect farm regis-

Mr. Wingert said that standards of farm efficiency and productivity have been made more rigid and, if farm registrants are to receive a farm deferment after the first 2-C, the employer must show evidence that an attempt has been made to find a replacement for the registrant for whom dest ferment is asked. This must be done through a newspaper ad, reguest through the Employment Service, or other method.

said that in many cases registrants At or employers have been careless in not supplying full information. He recommended that registrants desiring 2-C classifications should complete the OF-4 farm form completely giving all data as to full time and part time persons employed on farms; filing medical statements in case of disabilities; affidavits as to any drought or misfortune that may conditions. If a registrant operates a farm through partnership lease or other arrangement, proof of that operation arrangement must be supplied with a copy of lease or partnership.

Mr. Wingert said that the Agricultural Security Committee is an advisory board only; it does not make any final decisions. nly purpose of the committee i to supply the Local Draft Board vith information regarding the registrant and his operation. He also said that it is the responsibility of the registrant or his employer to supply all of the necessary information.

Mr. Wingert said, that if OF-4 forms are needed or additional help in completing the forms were needed, that help could be obtained at the County Agricultural Agent's Office. H. Ira Blixt is Secretary to the Committee.






