If he gets married, the premium automatically drops by nearly ninety dollars. Why is his insurance premium dropped by almost a third, practically overnight? Studies made by insurance companies point out that a teen-ager will have fewer accidents after marriage, having developed more responsibility.

"There will be no such thing as the 'farm states' in American politics by 1982,55 the Washington

editor told an audience of southern businessmen here tonight. "the agricultural states will become increasingly industralized. This process has already begun. from work done away from the families-will come trom non-farm work, from employment in light industry, service trades, and other

"Who will produce the food?" "The mechanization of farms has already enabled us to produce more with fewer farm workers. This process will continue. In 25 years, American farms will produce one-third more food and fiber with 40 per cent fewer farm workers," the editor told his audi-

"The political effect of this economic change will be that the farm bloc will begin to share the viewpoint of the industrial states. We will see fewer and fewer of those classic legislative and political struggles between agricultural and industrial interests," the Washington editor sadi.
