Work- A egg can be either large or small est ones. ers, both men and women, who have been disabled for over a year have until June 30, 1958 to file application for the disability freeze or for disability benefits if they are 50 or older. Those who have been disabled for a prolongperiod and wait until after June 30th may forfeit their rights to disability benefits at age 50 co maximum old-age benefits, and to benefits for their survivors.

Mr. Champlin pointed out that there is no deadline for those who file within a year from the time they become disabled. The June 30, 1958 deadline applies only to those who have been disabled for a prolonged period.


