emergence sprays. Mr. Carlson explained that constant use of heavy machinery tends to pack some soils into unproductive hardnans or to form hard layers of soil just below plow depth. These reduce a soil's ability to absorb water at the surface, decrease permeation of moisture into the lower levels, and may restrict normal root development in

Milk Inspectors Training School industrial milk inspectors will be conducted by the New York State Extension Service at Cornell University. Ithaca. May 6-9. Registration will take place the first. day of training at 11:00 A. M. in Stocking on the Cornell


Prof. James C. White, dairy industry specialist, and Charles W Hebblethwaite. county agricu tural agent said, the school will offer special training to milk company inspectors, who desire to become "qualified" under the New York State Sanitary Code. To hecome a qualified inspector und the revised state health code. school conducted by Cornell and later take field training under the supervision - of the State Health

Department Prof. White and Agent Hebblethwaite said the course being offered at Cornell will cover the following: fundamentals of milk propublic health.

Regulation 14 of the New York State Sanitary Code provides in part that each processor must arrange or make an inspection every dairy farm from which milk is received by direct shipment before applying for a 1959 health permit to process. These inspections shall be made by a qualified inspector acceptable, to the State Conmissioner of Health, accord-

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
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
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
