

self rescue and methods of rescuing another swamped craft. Using a paddle board or surf board, he showed ways of getting an unconscious or semi-conscious person aboard and ways of coming to the aid of tired swimmers. "Don't let go of the craft and

don't swim away from it," stressed Mr. Mason. "It's the best life. saving device in the world." The Water-Safety demonstrations are offered each year by the Allegany County New York Chapter of American Red Cross. Syd-

Safety Chairman. This summer a total of 1400 Allegany County Chapter residents have signed up for courses at the pool. These include classes beginners, intermediates. swimmers and advanced swimmers <u>classes in junor and senior life</u> saving and special classes for adults, all Red Cross accredited,
